Stealing Christmas

Christmas is coming! And so once again we prepare to celebrate the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! We do many things in preparation; decorate our homes and Christmas trees with bright and colored lights, bake holiday treats and tune in our radios to the stations playing Christmas music. It all helps to set the mood and gives a feeling of happiness and expectation.

Last week, I did something I usually do at this time of year to help myself get in the Christmas mood. I watched Dr. Seuss' "How the Grinch Stole Christmas" for the forty-somethingth time. I'm a huge Dr. Seuss fan and this show is one of the signs of Christmas for me. When it's on, I know Christmas is coming.

But watching it this time, a thought came to mind that never had before. Cream Cheese Pound Cake

1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese
1 1/2 cups butter
3 cups white sugar
6 eggs
3 cups all-purpose flour
1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Directions
Preheat the oven to 325 degrees F.

Grease and flour a 10-inch tube or Bundt pan.

In a large bowl, cream butter, and cream cheese until smooth

Add [sugar](#) gradually and beat until Fluffy.

Add eggs two at a time, beating well with each addition.

Add the flour all at once and mix in. Add Vanilla.

Pour into the pan. Bake for 1 hour And 20 minutes.

When the pound cake is ready, toothpick inserted into the center of the cakes will come out clean.

How Shadow of the Cross Became a "Virtual" Reality

Since Wednesday, March 25, 2020, Shadow of the Cross has had an online worship presence, and as of Sunday, November 28, 2021, we are at 93 segments and counting.

Our virtual ministry started with a 10:59-minute smart phone video of Pastor Brian Dupre delivering a midweek Lenten message, a prayer and a blessing from his home, after Michigan Governor Gretchen Whitmer issued a statewide stay-at-home order for all non-essential workers on March 23, 2020.

It started with his words of encouragement: "We don't have to be in the same place at the same time, because the church is not a building. The church is the congregation. And I encourage every one of us to reach out, to check up on, to send kind words, and to pray for our brothers and sisters. And I promise you I will do the same for you." It began by the Grace of God.

By June 14, 2020, we had progressed to live-streaming a full worship service from the sanctuary. Aaron Clark volunteered his time and his personal equipment every week to allow online access to the service through his YouTube account. Shortly after, SOTC obtained its own YouTube channel (link). All our videos combined have received around 4,700 views (a "view" is when a user intentionally initiates the watching of a video for at least 30 seconds).

At Pastor Dupre's request, in the spring of 2021, we applied for the "Esther 4:14 National Grant Program" offered by the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod's Office of National Mission. The stated purpose of this grant was "to encourage congregations to purchase equipment to meet the challenges of the day." The last part of Esther 4:14 reads, "yet who knows whether you have come to the kingdom for such a time as this?" As we all know, this "time" was the start of the global COVID-19 pandemic.

Our grant application to obtain a high-definition camcorder was accepted and in June we received \$1,150 to use toward the purchase of a camera to improve our live-stream capabilities. In addition, we purchased a mixer board to help with the sound (the acoustics in the sanctuary aren't so good for live-streaming) and a laptop to get the video onto the internet.



There have been some bumps along the way. But we are working on improvements to the sound and video quality. We are also working on increasing our internet capacity to produce a smoother picture with less interruption.

Even though SOTC returned to in-person worship services in the summer of 2020, maintaining our "virtual" presence online continues. Why is live-streaming important for SOTC? "Because we can reach people outside the local community as well as our own shut-ins to share the Gospel message of Jesus Christ," commented Pastor Dupre.

SOTC has only just begun its "virtual" venture. Stay tuned for progress updates as this aspect of SOTC's ministry expands to share the love of Christ with the virtual community
