"Do Not Misunderstand"

"You shall not lie with a male as with a woman; it is an abomination." Leviticus 18:22 ESV

"If a man lies with a male as he lies with a woman, both of them have committed an abomination. They shall surely be put to death. Their blood shall be upon them." Leviticus 20:13 NKJ

"Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: neither the sexually immoral, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor men who practice homosexuality, nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God." 1 Corinthians 6:9-10 ESV

"Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them. For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished. Therefore whoever relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven."

Matthew 5:17-19 ESV

We live in a world today that is all about relative truth; what you choose to believe is true for you and what I believe is true for me. The concept of absolute truth is dying. People simply don't want to believe that all of us are held accountable to the very same truth; that there is only one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, to which we all are accountable in thought, word and deed.

That truth today is called intolerant, insensitive, narrow-minded and politically incorrect. Today, we

must be accepting of all lifestyles, regardless of how offensive, how abominable, or how immoral it is or be labeled as all of these things. And because this type of thought has permeated all sectors of society, a new "designer Christianity" has taken over. People believe that they can pick and choose what to believe from God's Word based on whether or not it fits the lifestyle they choose to live. But do not misunderstand; just because God has given us the ability to choose, doesn't mean every choice we make is good, right and pleasing in His sight. If God says homosexuality is an abomination, who are we to say it isn't? If God says the sexually immoral and others will not inherit the kingdom of heaven, who are we to ignore His warnings and continue as if God is lying or just kidding. And if we continue to do things that are forbidden by God with no intention of heeding His warnings or repenting, how dare we call ourselves Christians?

Some will say that since Jesus' work of salvation is complete, we are no longer under the law. Therefore we do not have to abide by them. Those laws are no longer relevant. Do not misunderstand what "no longer under the law" means. It means we are no longer under the guilt of our sins that the law condemns us for. It means that for those of us who desire forgiveness shall have it in Christ Jesus.

Jesus came as our perfect sacrifice to make atonement for our sins, not to make the law irrelevant. He says Himself that not one iota of the law shall pass away until ALL is accomplished, meaning the entire work of salvation when ALL is restored to pre-fall condition as God created and intended it to be; and when ALL true believers are separated from ALL false and non-believers on the Last Day. Until that time, we are All accountable for everything mentioned in His revealed Word, that is displeasing in His sight. And we ALL will stand before God one day, either with Jesus as our defense attorney or without Him.

You may not like hearing that, but do not misunderstand; It is the truth; the absolute truth; for you and me and everyone else on this planet.
Whether you believe it or not makes it none the less true. Do not misunderstand, I am not condemning

anyone for the choices they make. It is not mine to judge. But it is mine, as your shepherd in Jesus' stead to warn. We all can live however we want to. But remember this; our thoughts, words and deeds and inactions have eternal and everlasting consequences. God bless you all! -Pastor Dupre

One-Dish Ground Turkey Sweet Potato Skillet

Ingredients

1 pound ground turkey

1 medium onion, chopped

1 shallot, finely chopped

3 garlic cloves, minced

1/4 cup tomato paste

1 medium sweet potato, peeled and cubed

1 cup chicken broth

2 teaspoons smoked paprika

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon pepper

3 cups chopped fresh kale

Dash crushed red pepper flakes

1 medium ripe avocado, peeled and sliced


Minced fresh mint, optional

Directions: In a large skillet, cook turkey, onion, shallot and garlic over medium heat until turkey is no longer pink and vegetables are tender, 8-10 minutes, breaking up turkey into crumbles; drain. Add tomato paste; cook and stir 1 minute longer.

Add sweet potato, broth, smoked paprika, salt and pepper. Bring to a boil; reduce heat. Simmer, covered, until sweet potatoes are tender, about 10 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add kale and red pepper flakes; cook and stir until kale is wilted, about 2 minutes. Serve with avocado and if desired, mint.
