Where Do I Find Answers?

Matt. 21:22 "And whatever you ask in prayer, you will receive if you have faith." -ESV

<u>Matt. 6:5-9</u> "And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. And when you pray, do not heap up empty phrases as the gentiles do, for they think that they will be heard for their many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask Him."—ESV

This may be the first devotion where the answer comes before the question. The answer is prayer. The question is where do I find the answers to today's challenges? Many of us with good intentions seek the answer to that question in all the wrong places. You may be surprised to find that the Bible is among the wrong places to seek that answer.

You see, the purpose of the Bible is not to show us how to solve our day to day issues, like what vocation does God have in mind for me or, what are the rules of dating or who is the person I should marry. That is not the purpose of the Bible and honest, fulfilling answers to these types of questions cannot be found there.

The purpose of the Bible is to reveal Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior to a broken, disenfranchised, sinful world. It is to reveal the love of God that comes through Jesus to us, for the creation and building of faith through the Holy Spirit. In other words, it is all about the reestablishment of the relationship between God and man. It is not about man's relationship to man or to the world. Does it talk about these things? Yes, but it purposely does not provide the useful, practical, day to day answers many of us seek in it. But that is why there is prayer. God clearly wants us to come to Him with all our issues; to seek Him first in all that troubles us and in all that we do. That is the purpose of prayer. Prayer is where we find the answers we seek. And God has promised in His divine Word that for those of us that pray in faith, our prayers will be answered. God will give us the comfort we seek.

We Pray: Dear heavenly Father,

In the stillness of our hearts and the quietness of ours thoughts, we come to You asking to hear our prayers, to grant us that which the heart desires and to comfort the troubling waters that cause us grief and pain. Create in us clean hearts and minds so that we may lay our burdens down before you in prayer and know that You shall remove them from us as You have promised. Grant us wisdom in all that we seek and do. In Jesus' name we pray, Lord hear our prayer, Amen.

Pan-Fried Chicken Breast with Mushroom Gravy

Ingredients:

4 (5 ounce) chicken breasts

1 teaspoon onion powder

½ teaspoon salt

teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

tablespoons olive oi1

(8 ounce) package sliced fresh mushrooms

2 cloves garlic, sliced

3/4 cup water

1/4cup dry white wine

1 (1.25 ounce) envelope dry chicken gravy mix

Instructions:

Sprinkle both sides of the chicken breasts with onion powder, salt, and pepper.

Heat oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Add chicken and cook until golden brown, about 5 minutes per side.

Add garlic and mushrooms and cook until mushrooms have released their liquid and are reduced in size, about 5 minutes.

Stir together water, white wine, and gravy packet in a small bowl and pour into the skillet.

Bring liquid to a simmer, cover, reduce heat to medium, and cook for 5 minutes. Turn chicken breasts and continue cooking until chicken is no longer pink in the center and the juices run clear, about 5 more minutes. An instant-read thermometer inserted into the center should read at least 165 degrees F (74 degrees C).
