Did you know that Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the season of Lent, falls on St. Valentines Day this year? There are two events that draw our American attention each February; the Super Bowl and St. Valentine's Day; two man-made reasons to celebrate. Now I realize that most holidays or reasons to celebrate are man-made, but some people treat the Super Bowl as if it were bigger, more important, and more worthy of our time and attention than the two God-made reasons to celebrate; Christmas and Easter. And by comparison and not including the greeting card, jewelry, candy and flower industries, St. Valentine's Day gets nowhere near the attention.

The truth is, St. Valentine 's Day should get more recognition than it does; after all, it is in honor of one of God's venerated servants. Maybe the reason it doesn't is because we really don't know much about St. Valentine. Maybe it's because companies like Hallmark, Jared and Kay Jewelers, FTD Florists and Godiva chocolates have made us think it's nothing more than a day to exchange gifts of love. Maybe that's why St. Valentine has become nothing more in our minds than the patron saint of little candy hearts and flowers. His name has become synonymous with cut-out paper hearts and other greeting cards.

However, Saint Valentine was a real person and much more than we have made him out to be. He was a Roman priest, a Bishop of Interamna (Terni) and His name was Valentinius. He was martyred (murdered because of his faith) during the reign of Claudius II. He was arrested and imprisoned for marrying Christian couples and aiding other Christians, who were at the time, being persecuted by Claudius in Rome. Helping Christians avoid persecution or otherwise was a crime, punishable by death. But Claudius took a liking to him; that is until Valentinius tried to convert him to Christianity. That's when Valentinius was condemned to death. He was beaten, stoned, and then beheaded. The exact date of his martyrdom is not known, but estimated to be between 269 and 273 AD.

Valentinius is not the patron saint of anything, however he was our brother in Christ. What he did, he did out of love for fellow Christians and love for Christ. So it makes sense that if we would associate him with anything, it would be love. We share something else with him too; we are also saints, according to our inheritance in Christ. All believers are saints. We do not have to be martyred to be called saints; the only requirement is that we the faithful, endure in faith until the end.

Valentinius and you and I have much in common. We suffer and are persecuted for the sake of the Gospel just as he did and was. Some of us may even be imprisoned or murdered because we are Christians. So when we celebrate St. Valentine's Day, we

aren't celebrating Eros, (erotic love) like the world has taught us to believe. We are celebrating Agape, (unconditional love), the love of God for mankind. This day should not only be celebrated with hearts, candy, and flowers, but with songs of praise to The God who loves us unconditionally and who sent His Son to die for our sins, for our salvation and so that we might be able to show that same kind of love to one another. When we celebrate St. Valentine's day, we are really celebrating the love of God and the faith of the saints that keeps us and preserves us through all adversity, until all adversity is done away with when our Lord , Jesus Christ returns. Amen. God bless us all. -Pastor Dupre

Simple White Cake

- 1 cup white sugar
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter
- 2 large eggs
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 ¹/₂ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 ³⁄₄ teaspoons baking powder
- ¹/₂ cup milk

DIRECTION

Gather all ingredients.

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease and flour a 9-inch square cake pan.
- 2. Cream sugar and butter together in a mixing bowl. Add eggs, one at a time, beating briefly after each addition. Mix in vanilla.
 - 3. Combine flour and baking powder in a separate bowl. Add to the wet ingredients and mix well. Add milk and stir until smooth.

Pour batter into the prepared cake pan.

Bake in the preheated oven until the top springs back when lightly touched, 30 to 40 minutes.

Remove it from the oven and cool completely. Enjoy!


