Two Precious Gifts"

"In that day you will ask nothing of me. Truly, truly I say to you, whatever you ask of the Father in my name, he will give it to you." John 16:23 ESV

How many of us, if given a brand new Mercedes Benz by our parents, would lock it up and drive it only to church on Sundays? How many of us if our inheritance included a sprawling estate on an island paradise, would reject it or use it sparingly as if we didn't really appreciate the gift? If I had to guess, probably not many of us, including myself, would treat these things given to us out of love by our parents like that.

The truth is we believers in Christ as our resurrected Lord and Savior have been given two precious gifts, far more valuable than any Mercedes Benz and we will inherit mansions greater than all the earthly estates combined. We have been given the gift of prayer and we stand to inherit everlasting life with Christ in Zion, the true paradise. Yet how do we treat these precious gifts? Do we use them and treat them as if they are irreplaceable? Or do we put them on the shelf or in the filing cabinet, hiding them from the world, using them sparingly, because we don't hold them in our hearts as precious and irreplaceable?

I bring this up only so that each of us may examine ourselves. As I said in a recent sermon, God has given every believer in Christ an "Open Invitation" to come and talk with Him through prayer, anytime, anywhere about anything. Do we really take advantage of that great opportunity? God has promised to hear the prayers of those who love and trust in Him and to respond. The verse above tells us that whatever we ask of the Father in Jesus' name, will be given to us. Now if we are foolish enough to waste our prayers asking God for mansions and Mercedes, when forgiveness, healing, salvation and fellowship with our Savior are still on the table and have not been requested, then we truly have a misguided concept of who God is and what His promise of fulfilling our prayers means. If you think I'm wrong, see you on the Last Day...uh no, I won't!

What a shallow, cavalier, disrespectful and spiteful way to treat something that God has given out of love for our own benefit. God loves us and wants to have a Father-child relationship with us. He is not obligated to love us, He certainly does not owe it to us, and we certainly did nothing to deserve His love. He gives this gift because HE desires to be our Father and our God. The promise of the precious gift of everlasting life should not be packed away, where it cannot be shared with others, so that they may come to know Jesus as Lord and Savior and share in the gift themselves. But if you are foolish enough to believe that the promise of everlasting is replaceable; then tell me, with what?

Prayer and everlasting life. My friends, God through Christ Jesus, has provided us with everything we need for now and the for world to come in these in these two precious gifts. Pray always and tell everyone of the promise of life everlasting that Jesus won for all believers. This is how we use these two precious gifts and how we show God that we truly appreciate the grace, love, mercy and blessings that comes to us through them. Houses and cars will crumble and rust away and will lose their value. But these two precious gifts of God will never perish and will never be less than precious. 30-Minute Crispy Breaded Chicken Breast Cutlets

Ingredients:

- $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups (90 g) panko crumbs
- 2 tablespoons <u>chopped parsley</u>
- 2 tablespoons (30 g) grated Parmesan cheese.
- 2 eggs
- ½ teaspoon granulated garlic or garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper, or ground black pepper
- 2 large boneless, skinless chicken breasts, about 1½ pounds total, sliced into cutlets.
- 1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil

Instructions:

- Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.
- Put two shallow bowls or pie plates on your work surface. Put the panko, parsley, and Parmesan in one plate and stir to

- combine. Crack the eggs into the other plate, then add the garlic powder, salt and cayenne and whisk until blended.
- Dip the chicken into the egg mixture, turning to coat on both sides. **Tip**: To keep your hands clean, use a pair of tongs or a fork to handle the chicken.
- Transfer the chicken to the panko mixture, turning it over to coat both sides with the crumbs. Nudge and press additional crumbs onto any bare spots. At this point, cook the chicken immediately, or arrange in one layer on a sheet pan, cover and refrigerate up to 4 hours ahead.
- Heat a large (preferably 12-inch) nonstick skillet over mediumhigh heat until a drop of water sizzles and immediately evaporates. Add a generous layer of olive oil (start with 2-3 tablespoons). Add the chicken breasts and cook until golden brown on one side, about 3 minutes. Gently turn the chicken over with a spatula and cook another 2 minutes. Note: If your pan isn't large enough to hold all the chicken without crowding, fry in two batches, two breasts at a time, adding more olive oil as needed.
- Transfer the chicken to a rimmed baking sheet. Place in the preheated oven and bake 10 minutes, until the chicken is cooked through.
- Place the hot chicken on a platter. Top with the greens and shave some Parmesan over with a vegetable peeler (or just use more grated cheese). Squeeze the lemon wedges over the chicken and serve.
