Are There Levels of Heaven?

Recently in one of our Bible study sessions the question of whether there are levels of heaven and if so how many and what are they. Well the suggestion was put forth that there are 7 levels of heaven, but that is not scriptural. The idea of 7 levels of heaven comes from Jewish Rabbinic literature such as the Talmud which teaches that there are 7 distinct levels of heaven.

Level 1 is called **VDON** – the place where the sun resides. Level 2 is called **RIGIA** – the place where the sun shines, and the moon, stars, and planets are fixed. Level 3 is called **SHECHAGIM** - in which are the millstones to make the manna for the pious. Level 4 is called **ZEBHUL** - where resides upper Jerusalem along with the temple and the altar. It is also the place where Michael, the chief angel-prince, offers sacrifices. Level 5 is called the **MAON** - where the "angels of the ministry" are located. Level 6 is called the **MACHON** - which contains the treasuries of snow, hail and the chambers of noxious dews. It also houses the receptacles of water, the chamber of wind, and the cave of mist, whose doors are of fire. Level 7 is called **ARABOTH** - the place where justice, judgment and righteousness reside. It also contains the treasures of life, of peace and of blessing, the soul of the righteous, and the spirits and souls of those who are to be born in the future. It also stores the dew by which the dead are to be raised. (https://www.biblestudy.org/question/seven-heavens.html)

I remind you that this is according to Jewish tradition, not the Bible. However, the Bible suggests there are at least three levels of heaven. In 2 *Corinthians 12:2* Paul refers to himself in the third person when he said, "I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven— whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows." If there is a third heaven, there must be at least a first and second heaven. It has been suggested that the first heaven is the sky, the atmosphere we live in including the air we breathe and the stratosphere where the birds fly as evidenced by *Genesis 6:7* - So the Lord said, "I will blot out man whom I have created from the face of the land, man and animals and creeping things and birds of the heavens, for I am sorry that I have made them." *James 5:8* says - Then he prayed again, and heaven gave rain, and the earth bore its fruit.

It has also been suggested that the second heaven is the celestial heaven referring to outer space, where the sun, moon and stars reside as evidenced by *Matthew 24:29* which says, "Immediately after the tribulation of those days the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light; the stars will fall from heaven, and the powers of the heavens will be shaken".

It has been suggested that the third heaven is the dwelling place of God. While God does not reside in one particular area, there is a place where His presence dwells in a unique way. Although the exact location of the abode of God is not revealed in Scripture, it is spoken of as being above the first and second heavens. 1 Kings 8:27 says - "But will God indeed dwell on the earth? Behold, heaven and the heaven of heavens cannot contain You. How much less this temple which I have built". We may not know the exact location of the dwelling place of God in the heavens but what we do know is that there is a designated place as evidenced by *Hebrews 8:1* which says - "Now this is the main point of the things we are saying: We have such a High Priest, who is seated at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in the heavens." If we are interpreting these 3 levels correctly and if there are other levels of heaven, does it really matter? God has revealed to us already what He wants us to know. The "what

and where" don't matter because we will all find out someday.

EASY HOMEMADE APPLE HAND PIES

Ingredients:

Pastry Dough:

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon granulated sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter, cut into 1/2-inch cubes
- 1/3 cup water, very cold (ice cold)

Apple Filling:

- 2 large apples
- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1/3 cup granulated sugar (+ more for topping, optional)
- 2 tablespoons cinnamon
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon all-purpose flour
- 1 egg, beaten (for egg wash)

INSTRUCTIONS

Pastry Dough: Add flour, sugar, salt and butter into a <u>food processor</u>. Pulse on and off until flour mixture forms into small pieces of dough, approximately 1 minute.

- 1. Drizzle ice water into the mixture (ice water is the key). Close the lid and continue to pulse on and off for another 1 minute, until the dough turns into a breadcrumb consistency.
- 2. Transfer dough (breadcrumbs consistency) on a work surface. Use your hands to squeeze all the pieces together until it forms into a dough. Shape it into a smooth disc. Wrap the disc in <u>plastic wrap</u> and refrigerate for 1 hour.

Apple Filling:

- 1. Peel, core and cut the apples into 1/2-inch cubes. Place apples into a large bowl filled with water (to prevent browning).
- 2. In a saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Stir in apples, sugar, cinnamon, brown sugar, and salt. Cover and stir occasionally for 5 minutes or until apples are slightly softened. Stir in flour and continue to cook until apples are soft and tender (but not mushy), and the filling has thickened. Remove from heat and cool to room temperature.

Assembling and Baking Apple Turnovers:

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 F.
- 2. On a lightly floured surface, roll out dough to 1/8-inch thickness (or the thickness of a cardboard box). Cut out dough into 6-inch circles.
- 3. Place 1/3 cup of apple filling at the centre of each circle. Fold over the dough, leaving a 1/2-inch overlap. Push down to seal the filling. Fold over the overlap and press down to seal the edge.
- 4. Crimp the edges using your fingers or a fork (see photos above in post). Transfer turnovers onto a parchment-lined <u>baking tray</u>.
- 5. Brush egg generously on the top surface and sprinkle some sugar on top (optional). Cut out three small ventilation holes on top of the turnover. Bake for 25-30 minutes, until the pastry is lightly browned.
