Fear vs. Faith"

²² Immediately he made the disciples get into the boat and go before him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. ²³ And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, ²⁴ but the boat by this time was a long way from the land, beaten by the waves, for the wind was against them. ²⁵ And in the fourth watch of the night he came to them, walking on the sea. ²⁶ But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, and said, "It is a ghost!" and they cried out in fear. ²⁷ But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid." ²⁸ And Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." ²⁹ He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water and came to Jesus. ³⁰ But when he saw the wind, he was afraid, and beginning to sink he cried out, "Lord, save me." ³¹ Jesus immediately reached out his hand and took hold of him, saying to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?"

I know I have addressed this topic before, but the question remains: Why can't we accept the evidence of our eyes and ears? Simple; we fear. We fear the truth. We fear letting go. We fear change. We fear the unknown and the unexpected. We fear the future. We fear people of different races and nationalities. We fear different cultures and cultural practices. We fear! We fear believing what we see with our eyes because it is frightening! You see, our fear erodes our faith. It takes our focus off of where it should always be; on Jesus. How many of us would have had the strength of faith to do what Peter did? How many of us would have stepped out of the boat (our comfort zone; our safe place), even on the authority of Jesus, the King of Creation, onto water. And not just water, but in the middle a lake, where the wind was beating wave after wave against the boat! At night! And not only step out of the boat, but attempt to do what our minds tell us is humanly impossible; to walk on the water!! It took great faith! I don't know about you, but even with Jesus standing right there calling me to come to Him, I'd have a hard time getting out of that boat! Yet, even after that leap of faith, Peter allowed his fears to overcome him.

Unfortunately, it is much easier to give in to our fears than to face them in faith. When Peter stepped out of the boat, he was doing fine. He was walking on water just like Jesus. Until he looked around and realized that he shouldn't be able to do it. That little left shoulder devil got to Peter and made him doubt what Jesus had told him he could do. And immediately Peter began to sink among the waves. But if Peter had held faith, he wouldn't have sank. But fear overcame him, and his faith diminished. Fear and faith cannot exist in the same place at the same time. If you have one, the other is absent. And in this world gone mad, it is hard to find someone you can trust. Sometimes, even those who are supposed to protect us, take advantage of their power over us. Sin has changed this once garden paradise to a hell on earth. And yes, it is frightening. The way the world is today, it seems fear is here to stay and faith is just passing through. In the battle between fear and faith, it appears that faith has long since

been defeated. But what did Jesus says to his disciples when they saw Him walking on the water? He said, "Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid." Our faith alone may seem to be no match for fear. But when Jesus grabs hold of our hands like He did to Peter in the, water, our faith is perfected! And Peter knew who to call on when his fat was in the fire, and so do we. And just like the disciples did at the end of the text, we confess to Jesus, saying, "You are truly the Son of God." For only the Son of God could have done what Jesus did for us on the cross; He defeated sin, Satan, death and hell. And in doing so took away all reason to fear. By faith even fear has been defeated. We have no reason to fear because all of our enemies have been defeated. No matter what happens, we will be on safe shores. And by grace through faith, that future is certain. We will be with Jesus in the His kingdom forever into eternity.

Easy Rib Eye Roast

Ingredients

- 1 cup softened butter
- 6 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 (4 pound) bone-in rib-eye roast
- sea salt and cracked black pepper to taste

Directions

Gather all ingredients and preheat the oven to 500 degrees F (260 degrees C).

Beat butter and garlic together in a bowl.

Poke several holes in rib eye with a sharp knife. Rub butter mixture all over meat and season with salt and pepper. Place rib eye fat-side up in a roasting pan.

Roast in the preheated oven for 20 minutes.

Reduce heat to 325 degrees F (165 degrees C) and continue cooking until rib eye is reddish-pink and juicy in the center, 1 1/2 to 2 hours. An instant-read thermometer inserted into the center will read 145 degrees F (63 degrees C) for medium.

Prep Time: 10 mins Cook Time: 1 hr 30 mins Total Time: 1 hr 40 mins
