Holiday Cherry Pie

Ingredients

- ³/₄ cup all-purpose flour
- ¹/₄ cup white sugar
- 1 teaspoon packed brown sugar
- ¹/₄ teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 6 tablespoons butter, softened
- 1 (9 inch) unbaked deep dish pie crust
- 1 (21 ounce) can cherry pie filling
- ¹/₄ teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ¹/₃ cup sliced almonds

Directions

- 1. Preheat an oven to 425 degrees F (220 degrees C).
- 2. Whisk together the flour, white sugar, brown sugar, nutmeg, and salt in a bowl. Cut the softened butter into the flour mixture using a pastry blender until crumbly; set aside.

- 3. Bake the pie crust in the preheated oven for 10 minutes. Remove from oven; reduce oven temperature to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- 4. Stir together the cherry pie filling and cinnamon. Pour into the prepared pie crust. Sprinkle crumb topping over the pie, then sprinkle with the sliced almonds.
- 5. Bake in the preheated oven until crumb topping is lightly browned, about 45 minutes. Allow it to cool for about 30 minutes before slicing. Serve warmly.

Prep Time: 10 min Cook Time 55 min Additional Time: 30 min.

Total TIME 1hr 35 min Serving 6 Yield: 1 9-inch-deep dish pie.
