""Wisdom Without Knowledge"

"Hear the word of the LORD, O children of Israel, for the LORD has a controversy with the inhabitants of the land. There is no faithfulness or steadfast love, and no knowledge of God in the land; My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge; because you have rejected knowledge, I reject you from being a priest to me. And since you have forgotten the law of your God, I also will forget your children."

-Hosea 4:1.6

Let me begin by saying; thank you Lord God for bringing us to the beginning of another year, with the opportunity to renew our faith and refresh our spirit! Have you noticed that more and more people are putting their faith and trust in things which they have no knowledge of at all? Have you noticed that they are beginning to speak boldly about things which are speculative at best? Have you heard these people speak wisdom without knowledge? I have; over and over again.

The one of the wildest was that the world would end December 21, 2012 based on the cycle of the Mayan calendar. Now have you noticed that we are all still here and the world is still intact 12 years later almost to the day? It's not because of some miscalculation; and it is not by happenstance that we are still here; it is by grand design.

You see, what the prophet Hosea warned Israel about in the passage above is the same sin many today are guilty of. Where Israel rejected the Law and faith in and had no knowledge of God, we too are guilty of these things and we have carried it a step farther. Many of us who have no knowledge of God, His Word, His Son, or His promises speak about them as if we do. We talk about things that only God can bring about as if Mayans, Martians, or even mankind had such power. That is wisdom without knowledge...ignorance, stupidity, and foolishness. The truth is there is no wisdom without knowledge. We cannot be wise in the ways of anything that we have not put time and effort to gain and retain knowledge of.

Yet we have a modern day cult that has built a life-sized version of Noah's Ark to take refuge in when the next great flood covers the earth. In Genesis 9:11 God tells us never again will there be a flood to destroy the earth. We have all sorts of predictions of the day the world will end. Matthew 24:36 says, "But concerning that day and hour, no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only."

We have people who believe homosexuality is merely an "alternative lifestyle" instead of the abomination that God says it is in Leviticus 18:22. All of these sins are wisdom without knowledge...ignorance, stupidity, and foolishness. Psalm 111:10 says, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom; all who practice it have a good understanding." Proverbs 10:14 says, "The wise lay up knowledge, but the mouth of the fool brings ruin near." That means that there cannot even exist the beginning of wisdom without the fear (knowledge, love, faith and reverence) of the Lord. Likewise, only the wise seek knowledge. Therefore, there is no wisdom without knowledge, and knowledge embraced.

So, let's call wisdom without knowledge what it is; deception from the great deceiver whose only purpose is to separate us from faith in and knowledge of God; to despise and reject His Law, Word and promises. Let Hosea's warning to Israel be a warning to us all. And let us agree that when we hear our brothers and sisters speaking wisdom without knowledge, that we not let

them live in ignorance and deception but point them to the truth that has come into the world in Jesus Christ. God bless you all!

Ranch Buffalo Wings

INGREDIENTS

- ½ cup Butter Melted
- ¼ cup Hot Sauce
- 3 Tablespoons White Vinegar
- Chicken Wings or Drumettes 24
- 2 Tablespoons Hidden Valley Original ranch seasoning Salad
- dressing mix saker cup

Steps (2)

THIS RECIPE IS AIR FRYER-FRIENDLY

Simply reduce the cooking time and temperature on your air fryer as shown here. *

Timing

Set air fryer timer for half the cooking time of a conventional oven. Add extra time for doneness if needed.

Temperature

Reduce regular oven temperature by 25° to 50° (not going below 350°) on your air fryer. If food is getting too dark, reduce by another 25°.

• * Always follow the manufacturer's instructions.

In a small bowl, whisk together butter, hot sauce and vinegar. Dip drumettes in butter mixture; arrange in single layer in large baking pan. Sprinkle with ranch seasoning. Bake until chicken is browned and an internal temperature of 165°F has been reached, about 30 to 40 minutes. Serve hot with celery and Hidden Valley Original Ranch dressing, for dipping.

Preheat oven to 350°F.
