Do Not Be Deceived"

Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one sows, that will he also reap. For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life. –Galatians 6:7-8 ESV

We live in a crazy world. It's hard to image it can get any worse than it already is. And maybe that is a good thing; maybe it is a sign that the Last Day is close at hand. You know you can't call a thing what it is anymore without being labeled as "out of touch", "intolerant", "ignorant", or "politically incorrect." Whatever we are called, we who speak the truth are somehow in the wrong. It seems people want to live in a fantasy world where anything goes as long as it doesn't affect anyone else. In other words I can do whatever I want, be whoever I want to be, without having to be responsible for the consequences of my decisions. After all, how dare you judge me!

If you don't see it, let me make it clearer for you. Men are not women, even if they want to be and have surgery or hormone therapy to make them appear that way. Likewise, women are not men for the same reasons. And no single person is a "we" or "they" even if that's what that person wants to be identified as. Yet many people still fight to change who God made them to be physically; maybe because the grass appears green on "the other side", or maybe because they are not comfortable in their own skin or feel inadequate for whatever reason. This has led many of people to think they can "correct God's mistake" and change who they are by changing their appearances. But the truth is, changing our appearances doesn't change who God made us. It only masks the truth and deceives ourselves.

Friends, this is called self-deception and is one of the greatest tricks Satan has put upon us. Regardless of what we look like or try to appear to be on the outside, a man is a man, and a woman is a woman on the inside; and none of us are plural in existence; just as God determined. A man cannot think and feel in the same way a woman can and neither can a woman think and feel as a man, no matter how badly we may want to. God made male and female differently purposefully. The women in my life have given me many insights that never would have occurred to me had they not shared their thoughts with me. Likewise, I have had the same impact on these very same women. If we are going to be offended by anything, why not be offended by the very idea that we know ourselves better than God, who created us?

Do not be deceived; God WILL NOT be mocked by our callous love of self and our desires. He Will Not be mocked by our callous disrespect for whom He made us to be. These are GREAT sins! If we are feeling inadequate with ourselves, why not call upon the one who created us to bring about understanding or a change of heart, which only the Holy Spirit can do? Why put our trust in and rely on the surgeons or the doctors, who are just as sinful and fallible as we are to create something we call better in us? Here is our warning, when we rely on the flesh, from the flesh we will reap corruption. But when we rely on the Spirit, from the Spirit we will reap eternal life. God bless you all in Jesus' name! -Pastor Dupre

Sirloin Tips and Mushrooms

Ingredients:

- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 ½ pounds beef sirloin steak, cut into cubes
- 1 (16 ounce) can mushrooms, with liquid
- 1 (8 ounce) can tomato sauce
- ¾ cup red wine, or more to taste
- salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste

Gather all ingredients.

- Heat oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Add beef and sear until browned on all sides, 5 to 7 minutes.
- Stir in garlic and cook until fragrant, about 1 minute.
- Add undrained mushrooms, tomato sauce, red wine, salt, and pepper.
- Simmer until beef is tender, about 30 minutes, adding a little more wine if desired. An instant-read thermometer inserted into the beef should read 140 degrees F (60 degrees C) for medium.

 This sirloin beef tip recipe features beef sirloin cubes browned with garlic, then simmered in tomato sauce and red wine until tender. It's great over buttered noodles.


On the March 30 Youth Sunday, our congregation dedicated the newly arranged Youth Center for the use of our young Christians. The dedication program began with the last hymn of the worship service - "This Little Light of Mine." Congregation members then processed to the Youth Center singing "Lord Prepare Me." Pastor Dupre offered a prayer to dedicate the Center, then the ceremonial ribbon was cut, and everyone entered the room to celebrate and view the Center.

This Youth Center, located in room #103, features a comfort zone, along with desks, chairs, games, a television, computer and a small library. There are also numerous pictures of our SOTC Sunday School students, events and programs since 2019.

Members are encouraged to partner with our young members in the Youth Center by sharing skills. For offsite events, volunteers are also needed to serve as chaperones and drivers.

Please check out our calendar, invite your youth to consider confirmation, to carry the cross during worship services, and to serve as an acolyte or usher.

Youth meetings are held on the 1st Sundays or on the 5th Sundays of each month. The Youth Fellowship is supported by the Board of Parish Education, the Unity Ministry team, and the Board of Elders liaison.
